- A: Being Rush Chair was a challenge but one that I had such a passion for and has

In heading Rush, my style of leadership was to not ask any of my sisters to undertake any part of the process that I was not willing to do myself. That concept worked well for me in 1971 and continues to work for me today.

Susan went on to say that AGD opened doors of both leadership and involvement for her and made her college experience both fun and rewarding. She credits AGD for developing her passion to serve and lead.

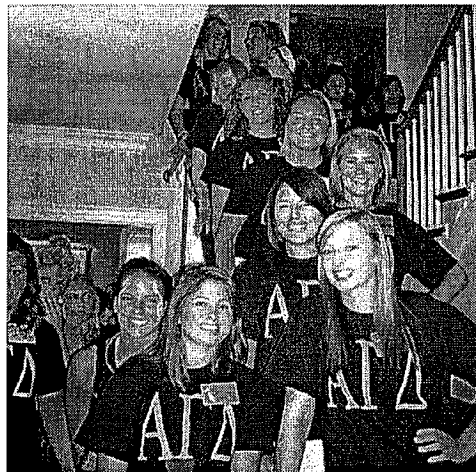
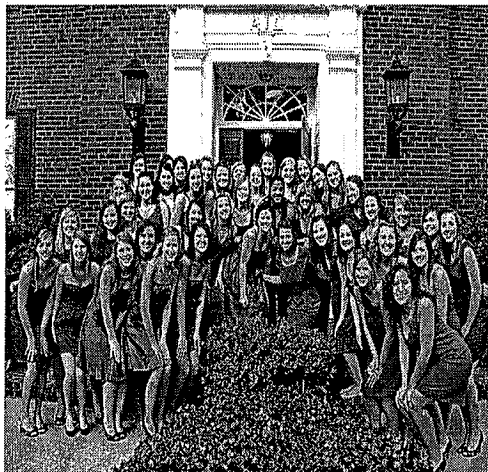

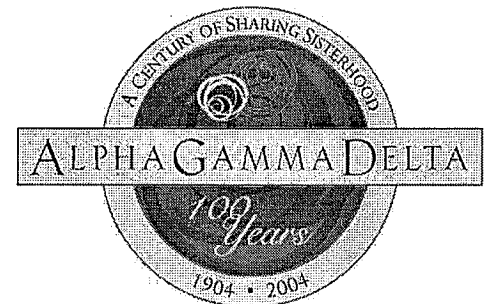
